  - a. Approve continued arrangements to monitor the two defibrillators for which the Parish Council is now responsible.

  - b. Propose the Parish Council provides dispensers and bags for dog waste.
  - c. Consider the increased provision of bins for dog waste.

a. Propose that a provision is made to supply bulbs to Yarnfield for the village green and for the roundabout on Yarnfield Parkway. Does Cold Meece require a similar provision? If so, for where?

b. Propose that a provision is made for bedding plants to be provided at the end of May/ beginning of June for Yarnfield. Does Cold Meece require a similar provision? If so, for where?

### **Public health advice when attending parish council meetings**

1. Anyone coming to a parish council meeting is expected to have a lateral flow test which must report a negative result.
2. Face masks must be worn when moving around the conference centre but can be removed when seated in the meeting.
3. Social distancing must be maintained when in the conference centre; the room in which the meeting will be held will allow for seating that is in line with social distancing rules.
4. Hand sanitiser will be available at the entrance of the conference centre and should be used on entering the building.
